Bull Mountain Trail Network

Work was started in 2015 to expand the existing trail network with funding from the National Trails Coalition and the BC Off Road Motorcycle Association and with direction and guidance from the Ministry of Recreation Sites and Trails BC.

There is now a permanent staging area complete with kiosk and outhouse while the trail network has had numerous improvements to make the trails more sustainable and to address environmentally sensitive areas. Mapping and signage of new and existing trails will continue over the next few years.

The trail network consists of two pee wee tracks at the staging area for younger riders on minibikes that can be easily supervised while the single track trails branching out from the staging area vary in length from a few kilometers long to over 25 kilometers long. They are identified as easiest, more difficult and most difficult. All of the trails are designed as single track, motorcycle only and are bi-directional. In order to help preserve the trails we ask that you please refrain from riding quads and side-by-sides on them.

The trail network is for the general public's use but people are encouraged to support our club by becoming a member and to get involved with future trail development and trail maintenance.

This is open range country between May and October each year. Please slowdown and use caution around livestock.

Camping is allowed at the staging area but we request that you do not light campfires particularly in the dry season. Please leave the area clean for the next person and pack out your garbage.

The Bull Mountain Trail Network can be found by taking Bull Mountain Road off Highway 97 north of Williams Lake and following the signs approximately 5 kilometers up the Smokey Mountain Forest Service Road.
